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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

Dalgaon Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Adarsha Mahavidyalaya also known as PDUAM, Dalgaon, is a newly established Govt. model degree college in Dalgaon, Dist.-Darrang, Assam named after Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya, a great thinker, philosopher, economist and sociologist of the country. The college was established in 2017 and is funded by Rashtriya Uchchattar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA-1.0), Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. This college is an initiative to provide opportunities for higher education in educationally backward districts where Gross Enrolment Ratio (GER) for higher education was less than the national GER (19%) in the year 2008-2009.

Dalgaon is a rural area situated in Darrang district of Assam. The place is surrounded by intensive agriculture based villages and mostly inhabited by minority Muslim population. Dalgaon is also home to many other communities making it a multi-ethnic and multi-cultural region. Majority of the inhabitants belong to low income groups and it is seen that very less number of youth pursue higher education.

The college started with a small group of 186 students in Science stream with 6 under graduate programmes in Botany, Chemistry, Computer Science, Mathematics, Physics and Zoology. The college has applied for affiliation under Gauhati University and has received special permission to start TDC (Science) from the session 2017-2018. In the last assessment session (2022-2023), the college was imparting education to 312 UG students in Science stream. As this is the only Science college of the Dalgaon LAC, the college receives young minds from diverse demographics aspiring for higher education in Science stream.

The college campus is 300 meters from the southern side of NH 15 and is well connected via roads. The campus is eco-friendly and covers an area of 14.1386 acres and it is surrounded with concrete walls. The college provides faculty as well as staff quarters, making it a residential campus.

College motto:

Vision

To provide equity and quality education to the educationally, socially, and economically weaker sections of the society.

- To encourage scientific inquisitiveness for constructive social transformation.
- To accelerate the inclusion of female students, and the persons with disabilities in higher education.
- To promote collaboration with industries and other organizations for research and add-on courses for the students for skill development and enriching academics.
- To prepare young minds of this region to be productive members of their community, society and country at large.

1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

Institutional Strength

Following are the strengths of the college:

- Pupil-Teacher-Ratio is very good.
- The environment is eco-friendly and away from hustle and bustle of the city.
- Good connectivity - as the college is situated near NH 15.
- Wide range of students from diverse demographics.
- Young and energetic teaching and non-teaching staff.
- Furnished library.
- Playground for sports activities.
- Active NSS Wing.
- Open air theater for cultural activities.
- Solar power generation of 10 KW
- Rain water harvesting and fish breeding tanks.
- As college is newly established, all the development works so far started from zero km post.

Institutional Weakness

Following are the weaknesses of the college:

- Most of the nearby communities are not motivated to pursue higher education resulting in enrollment below our expectation.
- The college does not have an auditorium and sports complex.

- The college does not have a building for the college canteen.
- No functional gymnasium.
- The boys' hostel is under construction.
- The girls' hostel is non-functional as students are unable to bear their mess fees.
- Inadequate solar power generation to provide uninterrupted power supply throughout the college.
- Limited number of ICT class rooms.
- Some of the sanctioned posts are still lying vacant.
- No transportation facility for students provided from the college.

Institutional Opportunity

Following are the opportunities of the college:

- Only college in this region (Dalgaon LAC) with Science stream for students aspiring to pursue higher education.
- The college is situated in an intensive agricultural area; hence, it can contribute immensely in increasing productivity through sustainable means by sharing scientific and modern technological knowledge.
- Free unused land is available for future prospects.
- Dynamic students and faculties with vision for nation building.
- The college has potential for botanical and herbal gardens.
- The college has potential for restoration of the ecosystem in the college.
- The college has potential for initiating various skill-based certificate courses.
- The college has potential for conducting various outreach programmes.

Institutional Challenge

PDUAM, Dalgaon started its journey from scratches. All the components of a Higher Education Institute have to be considered at the same time with equal strength to further develop the college. The paucity of time and

funds is posing hinderance in the multi-fold progress of the college. Following are the challenges faced by the college:

- Due to poor economic status, some students are forced to become breadwinners for their families quite early in their lives, hence, they don't pursue higher education.
- Most of the students are first generation learners.
- Very less number of parents participate in Parent-Teacher's Meet.
- Students leave early from college due to lack of proper transportation.
- Lack of campus recruitment.
- Inability to self generate funds to carry out developmental works in the college according to our needs.
- Less number of trees as constructions are underway and saplings are often damaged by domestic animals from the locality.
- To increase support and participation of the local public.
- Due to shortage of funds, the capabilities of the faculties are less explored for research activities.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

PDUAM Dalgaon ensures effective delivery of curriculum through a systematic and well-planned procedure. The integrated academic calendars of the college correlating with its affiliating university; Gauhati University (GU) provide a comprehensive guide for our students. The college class routine includes periods for theory, practical, add-on and remedial classes along with extra-curricular activities. Whenever the need arises online classes are taken by the faculties to provide additional assistance to our students and the details of these classes are maintained. During COVID lockdown, a special routine for online classes was prepared and followed to conduct theory classes. The college introduced CBCS and NEP in 2019 and 2023 respectively. Presently, it is fully functional in all the programs.

In PDUAM Dalgaon, two classrooms are equipped with ICT facilities. Google Classrooms and WhatsApp are used to share additional study materials. In case of unavailability of prescribed texts, teachers share PDFs or provide photocopies. Internal Assessment is carried out through sessional examinations, class tests, home assignments, seminar presentations, attendance, model demonstration and group discussions. Answer scripts of internal examinations are shown to the students. Slow and advanced learners are identified on the basis of their performance in end semester examinations.

During 2022-2023 session, 17 Add-on courses were offered of which 3 could not be conducted because of insufficient enrollment. A total of 300 out of 332 total enrolled students have successfully completed their courses. The syllabi of these courses have been prepared by our faculties having experiences in the assessment

and evaluation process of Gauhati University by evaluating answer scripts and setting question papers for semester examinations.

Cross cutting issues relevant to gender, environment, human values and professional ethics are integrated into prescribed curricula/courses. Field trips/educational tours are organized by the Departments of Botany, Chemistry and Zoology. Besides, 5 departments have included project works as a tool of assessment to provide the opportunities of experiential learning.

Feedbacks of students, alumni, employers and teachers are collected (via Google forms) and analyzed. These feedbacks on various aspects such as syllabus, teaching-learning process, infrastructure, career prospects, skills etc. help to take corrective measures.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The criterion pertains to institution's regular academic activity and its efforts to serve students of different backgrounds and their abilities through effective teaching and learning experiences. Most of the students in our college, PDUAM Dalgaon, belong to the economically, socially and educationally backward minority community.

As part of the college's efforts to improve their learning experience, students are categorized based on their different learning levels. Accordingly, various strategies are adopted such as remedial classes, e-links, audio-video aids, etc. for slow learners and peer teaching, poster presentation, etc. for fast learners to help them improve their learning abilities.

The college has adopted Mentor-Mentee system to support and guide the students based on their unique individual needs. Teachers provide a variety of learning experiences, including individual and collaborative learning and combining traditional teaching methods with the use of the modern teaching aids and offering blended mode of teaching by use of Google Meet, Zoom App etc.

The college is equipped with ICT enabled classrooms where students participate in seminars and presentations. To strengthen their creativity, problem solving skills and critical thinking through practical experiences, the students are taken for excursions and field study trips apart from conducting experiments in the departmental laboratories. They actively participate in various extracurricular activities which exposes them to the problems afflicting the society and environment.

Teachers take initiative to learn and keep abreast with the latest developments, to innovate and continuously seek to improve themselves by participating in training programs, conferences, workshops, etc., thus striving for individual and institutional excellence.

The college has a transparent evaluation system with a centralized marking system of internal marks in accordance with the guidelines of its affiliating university, Gauhati University. It also has a grievance redressal mechanism in place to address possible errors in evaluation.

The college assesses the attainment of Programme Outcomes and Course Outcomes through direct (sessional examinations, project works, field reports, group discussions etc.) and indirect methods (analyzing the success rate of the students in higher education, self-entrepreneurship and employability, feedback from employers and alumni etc.). These assessments help to make teaching-learning process more effective and successful.

Research, Innovations and Extension

PDUAM Dalgaon has received financial grants twice from ASTEC (1.45 lakhs and 1 lakh) for organizing outreach programmes in schools and a weeklong workshop. Regarding integration of Indian Knowledge System (IKS), the college offers courses in Indian Language and Culture. Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) has been formed to foster the culture of innovation, awareness on IPR, and start-up ecosystem in the college. The college has taken major innovative initiatives such as Black Soldier Fly farming, study of market possibility of indigenous live aquarium plant propagation and its marketing, jute bag making, paper crafting and aquarium construction, vermicomposting unit etc. so as to encourage adoption of sustainable environmental approaches as well as to prepare students to be self-reliant. 13 workshops/seminars have been conducted on various topics such as Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), Career Counselling, NEP 2020, NAAC Assessment and Accreditation, and entrepreneurship during the assessment period.

A total of 79 extension services have been offered by the college in the last five years. Activities related to various social issues, environment and biodiversity protection, health and hygiene particularly pertaining to women, engendering scientific temperaments, school and village adoption programmes, support drives etc. were conducted during the period. The college has focussed on reaching every door in the region through observance of important events of national significance.

Moreover, intercollege faculty exchange program, seminar talks, hands-on practical in clinical laboratory etc. are some of the activities which have been conducted under the 6 MoUs signed during the assessment period.

Research and documentation are an important facet of the accreditation process. A total of **37** research papers have been published in UGC CARE listed, and Web of Science, ESCI and Scopus indexed journals by **11** faculty members in the last five years. Impact factor of these journals is in between 0.16 to 7.832. Moreover, 22 book chapters in different edited books of national and international publications, **2** papers in conference proceedings (International), **4** books and **1** edited volume (regional publication) have been published by **9** faculty members in the last five years. All these publications have ISBN numbers.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

PDUAM, Dalgaon is a newly established Govt. Model Degree College, where entire infrastructure has been granted by RUSA.1, and completed under RUSA.2. The college has adequate learning infrastructure viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment, etc. However, there are only two ICT enabled smart classrooms and two portable projectors. Necessary facilities are also available for cultural and sports activities such as open-air theatre, playground, etc. For surveillance, CCTV cameras have been installed in the college premises including inside a few classrooms. Wi-Fi facility is available for proper functioning of the administrative activities and Library software.

The Central Library of PDUAM Dalgaon is automated with the Integrated Library Management System. The Central Library has textbooks, reference books, print journals, magazines, newspapers, and previous years' university question papers. These are available for students and faculties. The library has subscription of British Council Library. It has also subscribed to NDLI and formed an NDLI Club.

Regarding IT facilities, the college has Internet connectivity and offers internet access to students in the computer centre as well as in the library. The institute regularly updates the internet connection every year.

Currently, the available Internet bandwidth is 150 MBPS, provided by BSNL (FTTH), through optical fiber link. Internet access is also provided using Wi-Fi routers.

Regarding expenditures incurred, the college has spent 52.6% of the total expenditure for infrastructure development and augmentation during the last five years. Further, 37.78% of the total expenditure has been used for maintenance of physical facilities and academic support during the last five years.

Student Support and Progression

PDUAM, Dalgaon has always given priority to student support. It aims to provide its students the best learning experience. As majority of the students in the college belong to below poverty line, most of the students have received fee waiver under the FEE WAIVER SCHEME, Govt. of Assam. Apart from FEE WAIVER SCHEME, students have also received scholarships under ISHAN UDAY SPECIAL SCHOLARSHIP FOR NER, POST MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP TO OBC STUDENTS, POST MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP TO ST STUDENTS, POST MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP TO SC STUDENTS, and POST MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP TO MINORITY STUDENTS.

Recognizing the need to strengthen and develop the students' skills and abilities in today's competitive world, the college has organized a total of 21 capacity development and skill enhancement activities during the last five years. Moreover, the college has organized training/seminars for career development. The college has also offered guidance to its students for entrance examinations.

PDUAM, Dalgaon has various committees/cells such as Internal Complaints Cell, and Anti-Ragging Committee for redressal of student grievances. These committees implement the guidelines of regulatory bodies, provide mechanisms for submission of grievances and timely address the grievances received from students. The committees also organize awareness programs for students on zero tolerance regarding sexual harassment and ragging.

A total of 217 students have graduated from PDUAM Dalgaon in the last five years. Out of them, 110 students have gone on to pursue higher studies or have landed jobs in various institutions. One student has qualified in Joint Admission Test for Masters (JAM, 2023).

A total of 8 cultural and sports programs such as College Week, Inter-College Sports Fest, etc. were organized in the last five years for students. These programs provide our students opportunities to learn beyond their classrooms, showcase their talents and enable them to shape their personalities.

Governance, Leadership and Management

PDUAM Dalgaon, a Govt. Model Degree college affiliated to Gauhati University, has a vision to provide equity and equality education to all the sections of the society. It strives to inculcate values of discipline, perseverance, team spirit and to enhance critical abilities in students. It also collaborates with industries and organizations to develop employability skills of the students.

The college functions as per the rules and regulations of UGC and DHE, Govt. of Assam. Governing Body

(GB) of the college is the supreme body for framing policies. It gives directions to the Principal to achieve the mission and vision of the college. Additionally, IQAC initiates, plans and monitors activities to increase the quality of education imparted in the college. Different committees and cells have been formed for effective functioning of the college.

For its funding, the college receives bulk of its grant from the government and a meagre amount has been self-generated. Besides, non-government funds have been received. It has a systematic financial management system to manage and monitor its financial transactions. Internal and external financial audits are conducted at regular intervals by the Chartered Accountant appointed by the college authority.

The college as a responsible institution provides various extension services to the neighboring community by providing free education for women, adopting village and schools, organizing awareness drives etc. for multi-dimensional social support.

The college has taken effective welfare measures for its employees. The employees are eligible to receive medical allowance as well as benefits under NPS. Besides, they are entitled to leave as per government rules. Faculty members are also granted leave to attend and participate in Faculty Development Program (FDP), Orientation Program (OP) etc. to enhance and upgrade their skills so as to incorporate elements of technology and innovative practices together with the best possible pedagogical approach. The institution has a mechanism of appraisal for teaching/non-teaching staff comprising of annual confidential report (ACR), UGC regulation, directives of the Govt. of Assam through DHE and student feedback. Further, teacher's performance in academic and extra-curricular activities is measured under CAS.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

PDUAM Dalgaon does not practice or promote discrimination on the grounds of caste, creed, religion and gender. Students belonging to diverse cultural, regional, social, communal, economic and linguistic backgrounds study without facing any sort of discrimination. Besides, various measures have been taken to provide an inclusive environment and sensitize students on social, moral and constitutional obligations. Ramps have been constructed to increase access for Divyangjan students in an effort to make the college more inclusive.

PDUAM Dalgaon ensures gender equity by strategically adopting an effective mechanism which includes conducting of Gender Audit, constitution of bodies such as Women's Cell, organizing self-defence programs for girl students, inclusion of female representatives in all institutional bodies including Students' Union among others. Moreover, pad vending machine, sanitary napkins etc. have been made available.

National and International commemorative days are observed to mould the students as responsible citizens. Students elect their representatives to the students' bodies through free and fair elections, thereby boosting their political knowledge and participation. Additionally, all members of the college fraternity follow the Code of Conduct.

Recognizing the need for sustainable practices in an area of rich biodiversity, and intensive farming and livestock rearing, the college has adopted Biodiversity Conservation and Solid Waste Management as one of its best practices. Further, to increase transparency and convenience in attendance recording, Online Attendance System has been adopted as its other best practices. Success has been evident in both practice.

Commitment of the college towards environmental sustainability is reflected in practices like framing the Green Policy, conducting Green and Energy audits, rain water harvesting, environmental awareness programmes in and outside the campus, developing effective mechanism for waste-management and vermicompost pit, Green Campus initiatives etc. Our best practices too exhibit our commitment for building a sustainable future.

Moreover, the college considers “providing service to the educationally backward groups” as its institutional distinctiveness. The college has taken numerous measures in this regard such as equipping its students with soft and hard skills to enhance their employability, conducting webinars and training programmes, promoting yoga for mental and physical well-being, career counselling, assistance in obtaining scholarships among others.

Institutional preparedness for NEP

1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:	Being an affiliated college of Gauhati University (GU), PDUAM, Dalgaon follows the curriculum designed by its parent university. In accordance with the syllabus provided by GU, the college currently offers three multi disciplinary courses (MDC) - a. Foundation of Mathematical Science, b. Foundation of Library and Information Science, and c. Humanities and Social Sciences-I: Makers of Modern Assam. The college aims to achieve all round development of students in an integrated manner by offering these MDCs as part of the curriculum.
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	The college waiting for official communication from affiliating university regarding academic bank of

	credits.
3. Skill development:	The college currently offers 9 skill based courses across disciplines. This includes 1. Functional Assamese, 2. Grammar and Composition Skills, 3. Apiculture, 4. Renewable Energy and Energy Harvesting, 5. Quantitative aptitude and Reasoning, 6. Ethnobotany, 7. Gender Sensitization, 8. Historical Tourism in North-East India, 9. Panchayati Raj in Practice, and 10. Mental Health and Hygiene. Further, the college offers 17 Add-on courses to enhance the employability of the students in the current competitive job scenario.
4. The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

Response:

PDUAM, Dalgaon follows the curriculum designed by Gauhati University. It designs its own Academic Calendar scheduling the academic and non-academic activities in accordance to the GU academic calendar. The following measures are taken for effective curriculum planning and delivery:

- The college has implemented a **College Academic Framework (CAF)** which provides guidelines to the teachers for carrying out academic functions in addition to the regular activities. Annual progress of the individual departments is documented and analyzed based on the framework. All academic aspects of a department are monitored and executed by the Department Academic Committee, under the CAF.
- The college has an “**Academic & Research Committee**” which prepares the general class routines, academic calendar, etc. The HoDs prepare their departmental class routines in compliance with the general class routine and allots classes to the teachers for a smooth classroom transaction. The HoDs ensure completion of courses by their departmental teachers within the stipulated time. The committee also conducts regular meetings to review teachers’ class progression, timely completion of courses along with analysis of the progression of students.
- The college conducts **academic and administrative audit** from the affiliating university i.e., Gauhati University. Senior professors from the university visit the college and thoroughly audit the documents related to academic and administrative processes of the college.
- The teachers usually adopt conventional teaching methods. ICTs are used as and when required. Besides, departmental seminars, project work, model making, group discussions, educational tours, field studies, home assignments, poster presentations etc. are assigned to the students as a part of their regular course work for effective teaching learning outcomes.
- **Parent-Teacher Meets** are sometimes organized to discuss various issues student-related and to receive feedbacks.
- The college has a functional **Examination Cell** to conduct internal and external examinations. It provides necessary support to the departments in conducting sessional examinations. It proposes sessional exam duration and the departments schedule exam dates without disturbing the regular classes. The Examination Cell strictly follows university guidelines for conducting external examination.
- Before the start of every new academic session the college uploads **admission notification** in the college website containing all necessary and relevant information (availability of courses, intake capacity, fee structure, seat reservation, other available facilities etc.). These are circulated by means of displaying hoardings at different adjacent locations.
- **Online class dairies/attendance registers of students** are duly maintained. The college has its

own online attendance system through which the college authority and parents/guardians can monitor the attendance of their wards.

- The students are always encouraged and advised to **use and access the library resources** available at the college Central Library. Library orientation programs are organized to familiarize them with library resources. Besides, library classes have been included in class routine.
- **Yoga and Games** (for development of student's mental and physical health) and **Remedial/Tutorial** (for students to bridge gaps in understanding and help them reach full academic potential) classes are allotted in the class routine.

Response:

PDUAM Dalgaon has taken several measures to integrate crosscutting issues related to professional ethics, gender, human values, environment and sustainability, etc. The measures taken by the college are mentioned below:

Gender: The institution itself is a co-educational institution. The institution has a Women Cell to sensitize the students, teachers and nearby communities on gender issues. The college makes sure that every woman in the institution can work in a gender discrimination free work environment. For creating awareness, various programmes for women empowerment are organized by the cell. These include programmes on health camp, women's health and hygiene, interactive talks by experts on legal matters such as sexual harassment etc. The institution provides self-defense programs for the girl students.

Environment and Sustainability: The college offers a compulsory paper titled "Environmental Studies" in the under graduate program as part of the curriculum of Gauhati University. The paper deals with ecosystem, natural resources, bio-diversity and its conservation, environmental pollution, environmental policies and practices and human interaction with environment. The institution primarily works on environment and sustainability through the Eco-Club of the college. The college observes World Environment Day, World Wetland Day, Science Day, World Art Day, World Wildlife Day with programmes like awareness and cleanliness campaigns and plantation programmes. Additional efforts are made through the NSS unit of the institution to sensitize students on environment through activities like Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, tree plantation, and campaigns for creating single use plastic free environment. The college has installed a solar panel (10kw) to minimize the dependence on traditional sources of energy. Besides, official communications to the students, faculties and staff members through Gmail and WhatsApp groups have helped minimize the use of paper.

Human Values: The NSS unit of the institution takes initiative to observe World AIDS Day to increase awareness on HIV AIDS and show support for people living with and affected by HIV as well as to remember those who lost their lives to the deadly disease. Programmes like blood donation and free health checkup camps are organized by the NSS unit of the institution to foster values of compassion and develop a shared commitment to improving health and saving lives.

Professional ethics: The college maintains Attendance Registers of both the faculty and staff members which are regularly monitored by the Principal. Further, all kinds of leaves are processed and granted through proper channels in accordance to the Govt. Rules. In case, any teacher is on leave, his/her classes are taken by another teacher so that the classes are not hampered.

Over and above being an affiliated college, the curriculum of the Gauhati University is followed in the institution and it integrates to some extent, all the above cross cutting issues through different programmes

2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms**2.5.1**

Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

PDUAM Dalgaon follows the guidelines formulated by its affiliating university, Gauhati University (GU). Meanwhile, the internal evaluation is highly robust and fruitful in monitoring progress of students. The college has an Examination Cell which coordinates the external examinations as well as the internal sessional examinations. It co-ordinates with Academic and Research Committee to fix the schedule of examination. It also allots invigilation duties to the faculty members. The examination cell has a separate room to carry out confidential works.

Transparency of Internal and External Assessment Mechanism:

At the start of the academic session, the newly admitted batch is oriented with the process of assessment. They are made aware of the marks distribution of the UG-CBCS system as adopted by GU.

1. End Semester Mark:

- Courses with Practical: 60 (Theory)+ 20 (Practical)
- Courses without Practical: 80 (Theory)

2. Internal Mark:

- Sessional: 10

- Assignment: 6
- Attendance: 4

For internal assessment, unit tests are conducted at regular intervals, mostly after completion of every unit and the copies of the individual students are returned and discussed in the classroom after thorough evaluation, thus making the process transparent. Besides, regular discussions are held with students after evaluation of assignments. Sessional examinations are conducted centrally on dates allotted in the academic calendar and the checked answer scripts are made available to the students and in-depth discussions are held thereafter. Sessional examinations are re-conducted in case any student misses his/her examinations due to valid reasons. Open book examination, cross evaluation, sudden question setting, etc., are practiced in the college for assessment of the students.

Although there is little scope for the college in the external assessment of its students, steps have been taken keeping in mind their benefit. Strict invigilation is ensured by the college in the End semester examination. Teachers are not appointed as invigilators on the day examinations are held for his/her subject. Moreover, external evaluators are appointed for practical examinations so as to ensure impartiality and transparency at the same time.

Grievance Mechanism:

Our institution has a time bound and efficient system in place for addressing the academic grievances of the students. The college adopts both formative and summative evaluation approaches to measure students' achievement in all the programmes. Students can approach their respective teachers in case, his/her marks are below expectation. Moreover, the checked copies are made available to the students for cross evaluation. In case of any discrepancy, answer scripts are re-evaluated.

The HoD of each department is entrusted to look into the grievances of the students with utmost care. There is provision for the students to approach the higher authority if they are unsatisfied with the department level approach. In case of grievances relating to external examination, students are advised to approach the university as per the rules set by Gauhati University.

Response:

PDUAM Dalgaon follows the curriculum prepared by its affiliating university, Gauhati University. The college has a mechanism for evaluation of POs, PSOs and COs in place. This is done primarily through Direct and Indirect methods.

- 1. Direct method:** The College evaluates the outcome with the help of sessional examinations, problem-solving exercises, class tests, home assignments, project works, field reports, seminars, practical examinations, group discussions, case studies, excursions, etc.
 - Sessional examinations are conducted during each semester and form a part of internal assessment. The progress/performance of students is communicated by displaying their scores of the sessional examination on Departmental notice boards; occasionally result sheets are also sent to their guardians. Evaluated answer scripts are also shown to the students for crosschecking.

- Class tests are held regularly after completion of a topic or unit and at times in between the unit to keep tab on the understanding, skill and aptitude acquired by the students.
- Departmental seminars and group discussions are conducted among the students in each semester so that a guided interaction occurs among the participants on the different aspects of the relevant topics. It helps evaluate their understanding as well as enhances their communication skills and knowledge on the given topic.
- Field trip reports are also used to evaluate POs and COs. Students are taken to field trips and industrial visits which enhances their classroom learning by exposing them to the outside world. Their contextual and experiential learning and understanding are evaluated based on their field reports.
- Project work is an integral part of evaluation of POs and COs. It is an important assessment tool to evaluate both knowledge and skill. Students are given activities such as surveys, software development and soil analysis as part of their project work.

2. Indirect method: The college evaluates the attainment of COs, POs and PSOs by analyzing the success rate of the students in higher education, self-entrepreneurship and employability. The institution also collects feedback from employers and alumni.

- Feedback from employers of alumni help PDUAM Dalgaon evaluate the hard skills and soft skills learnt during the programme. Further, adaptability, decision making skills, time management and overall knowledge gained by the alumni are reflected in the employers' feedback.
- Alumni feedback is collected and evaluated regarding the teaching methods towards the attainment of COs, POs and PSOs. It makes the teaching learning process more effective as deficiencies pointed out help teachers take corrective measures.
- End semester examinations are conducted by the affiliating university of our college, Gauhati University. Not only are the question papers set by the university, the answer scripts too are evaluated in the zones set by it. Hence, the Course Outcomes (COs) and Programme Outcomes (POs) are assessed by the university. The marks obtained by the students are then analyzed and documented by the respective departments for further improvement in teaching methods.

3.2 Innovation Ecosystem

3.2.1

Institution has created an ecosystem for innovations, Indian Knowledge System (IKS), including awareness about IPR, establishment of IPR cell, Incubation centre and other initiatives for the creation and transfer of knowledge/technology and the outcomes of the same are evident

Response:

PDUAM Dalgaon has taken the following initiatives for creation and transfer of knowledge/technology:

(i) Black soldier fly (BSF) farming: Black soldier fly (*Hermetia illucenss L.*) is one of the most important species which can convert organic waste. BSF farming has been started by Department of Zoology, PDUAM, Dalgaon. A 100 square feet area was initially adopted for BSF farming. The specified area was captured by mosquito net. A mixture of organic waste and rice bane was supplied as food. College has so far supplied BSF larvae to Gauhati University and Silapathar College for farming.

(ii) Innovative measures/techniques to explore market possibility of indigenous live aquarium plant propagation as well as marketing: PDUAM, Dalgaon has designed two live aquariums (27.63 m³ each) to study the growth of aquarium plants and ornamental fishes. Two aquarium plants; *Brittle Leaf Naiad* (*Najas minor*) and *Hydrilla* were implanted in the aquarium and its market possibility is being explored.

Two species of *Nymphaea lotus*; **pink and white** were planted in the aquarium (local and exotic) for beautification. One more variety *Pygmy Water Lilly* was also planted in the aquarium. Two species of ornamental fishes (one of them is exotic) have been reared in the aquarium and their captive breeding is being studied.

(iii) **Exhibition on reuse of waste materials:** Department of Chemistry, PDUAM, Dalgaon took an innovative approach to deal with waste materials. An exhibition was organized among the students where participants were encouraged to utilize waste materials to create innovative and useful items. The theme of the exhibition was “Trash to Treasure” and it was organized on 27th May, 2023. Such innovative practices create awareness as well as encourage adoption of sustainable approaches and practices towards the environment.

(iv) **Birdhouse construction and installation and plantation of wild birds attracting food plants:** On 22nd June, 2023 a program on “Birdhouse Construction and Installation, and Plantation of Wild Birds Attracting Food Plants” was organized by Internal Cleanliness and Beautification Committee in collaboration with Eco Club and Department of Zoology. The main objective was to attract different bird species to the college campus and promote their conservation. Five birdhouses were installed and 5 samplings of *Bischofia javanica* were planted within the college campus.

(v) **Summer camp on eco-friendly jute bag making, paper crafting and aquarium construction:** A weeklong summer camp was organized by Department of Zoology to provide hands-on training on eco-friendly jute bag making, paper crafting and aquarium construction. This initiative aims to prepare students to be self-reliant without harming the environment.

(vi) **Vermicomposting unit:** Vermicomposting is a unique process that occurs in earthworm's gut to convert organic wastes into organic fertilizer or vermicompost by using joint action of earthworms and microorganisms. The Vermicompost unit of Department of Botany, PDUAM, Dalgaon was set up in 2023. The pit dimension is 8 feet in length and 4 feet in width. The earthworm species *Eisenia fetida* is being used as vermiworm in the pit. The raw materials used for vermiworm feed are biodegradable organic wastes and cow dung.

PDUAM, Dalgaon, as the only science college in Dalgaon constituency, has taken the responsibility to establish a healthy relationship with the neighborhood community since its inception. Emphasis is given on students' engagement to engender humanism, secularism, developing scientific attitude and feeling of universal brotherhood amongst the stakeholders. This ensures holistic development of the students and contributes to good citizenship for the nation.

The college executes the extension activities primarily through the following committees:

1. Research, Extension and Innovation Committee
2. Governance, Leadership and Management Committee
3. Women's Cell
4. NSS Unit
5. Eco Club

It has made efforts to sensitize farmers with the help of the local police on hazardous horticultural practices affecting the local bird population, and suggested alternative measures. Further, cleanliness and plantation drives, plog runs etc. were organized by the college to create public awareness on environment.

Blood donation and blood group detection camps were organized by the college with active participation of students and teachers to foster values of compassion and develop a shared commitment to improving health and saving lives.

Our college has worked extensively to promote health and hygiene, particularly women’s health. Talks have been delivered on menstrual health, diabetes, benefits of yoga etc. Additionally, a play was staged on women’s health.

Recognizing the need to create awareness on social ills, rallies; interactive programmes and talks on superstitions, gender discrimination and child marriage have been organized. In an effort to empower women, illiterate women have been taught to put their signatures. Besides, to promote road safety, a street play on traffic rules was staged too.

To create scientific temperament, PDUAM Dalgaon has organized lectures and donated microscopes through its outreach program, “Science as Fun Instead of Fear” in nearby schools. Further, lectures on relevant topics by eminent resource persons, training on model making and hands-on training in laboratories were given to school teachers and students in CBSIT-22 workshop.

Efforts were made to reach the community in times of humanitarian crisis like floods and COVID-19. During Covid 19 pandemic, the college organized awareness programmes and distributed sanitizers (prepared in college) and soaps. Relief materials were distributed and a post-flood sanitization program was carried out.

The college observes national festivals and commemorative days to promote the spirit of communal peace and nationwide integration among the students and public. Besides, World AIDS Day, World Environment Day etc. are observed to create awareness on health and environment.

In an effort to improve education at the root level, the college has adopted 6 schools. Through the School Adoption Programme, students and faculties take voluntary classes; friendly sports meet, cleanliness drives etc. are also organised. Besides, the college hosts school students who frequently visit its laboratories thereby inspiring them to study science in future.

The NSS unit has adopted Kocharipara Jungle under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and organized a 7-day Special Camp on plantation, cleanliness drive, health check and survey.

These extension activities of PDUAM Dalgaon shows its commitment to the society. Further, by emphasizing on community services, the college ensures its students engage in societal development.

Response:

PDUAM, Dalgaon is a newly established Govt. Model Degree College, where entire infrastructure has been granted by RUSA.1, and completed under RUSA.2. Provision of adequate infrastructural facilities for teaching and learning has always been a priority area for the institute. The institute has planned and constructed infrastructure to facilitate curricular and co-curricular activities. All the departments with practical classes are fully equipped with the necessary infrastructure to meet the ever-increasing requirements with adequate classrooms, seminar halls, laboratories and sufficient space for hosting all academic activities as shown below:

- There are **15** classrooms including a smart classroom and a conference room with projector facility (usually used for classes). Classrooms are equipped with WIFI facilities to enable effective learning experience. All the classrooms are spacious, hygienic, well-ventilated and equipped with white boards and furniture.
- There are small, separate cabin rooms for the faculty members equipped with storage cabinets.
- CCTV cameras are installed in the campus and inside a few of the classrooms
- Our Institute has four (4) fully equipped laboratories for Physics, Chemistry, Botany, and Zoology departments.
- There is Central Computing Facility with a total of **22** Computers in the college out of which **18** Computers are used for academic purposes/computer laboratory.
- WIFI is available for proper functioning of the administrative activities and Library software.
- There is a separate room allotted for IQAC.
- Separate room is allotted for Examination Cell.
- Canteen service is available for the staff and students.
- Cooler and filter is available for providing pure drinking water.
- There is a separate common room for girls and boys. A new Boys' Common Room along with a concrete building for canteen is under construction.
- Adequate toilet facilities are available for boys and girls separately.

Facilities for sports, games, and cultural activities

The institute encourages and facilitates the students to participate in various co-curricular activities to ensure their holistic development. The faculty members along with the Students' Union look after the extracurricular activities. Over the years, the college has developed a number of facilities for the students

to opt and participate in a variety of sports events. The infrastructure facilities are mentioned below:

- The college has an open-air theatre for conducting various cultural activities of the college. Also, the galleries and halls are used for cultural activities without hampering normal classes. The college is also equipped with public address system for conducting various events.
- The college has no separate room for gymnasium. However, various gym equipments like treadmills, dumbbells, barbells etc. are available.
- PDUAM Dalgaon has a playground for organizing various sports events like football, cricket, kabaddi, athletics etc.
- The college has indoor games facilities like TT, carom, chess and a separate sports equipment room.
- There is an elected Students' Union secretary for sports who works under the supervision of a Teacher-in-Charge for creating pro-active sports environment in the campus.

PDUAM Dalgaon has always prioritized the enhancement of its IT facilities. The college offers a variety of digital technical amenities. 2 smart classrooms and a well-equipped computer lab are available in the college. The college building is facilitated with Wi-Fi connectivity with restricted access to faculties and staff members. Classrooms are well maintained and monitored using CCTVs. IT facilities at both the institute and department levels undergo regular updates. The description of the same is provided below:

- **Networking Facility:** The institute regularly updates the internet connection every year. Currently, the available internet bandwidth is 150 MBPS. It is provided by BSNL (FTTH) through optical fibre link, Office and Library are connected to Campus LAN.
- **Wi- Fi Connectivity:** Institution has three networking routers ADSL 2+ 300 Mbps, MI Router 3c 300 Mbps and NET Link 300 Mbps to provide uninterrupted Wi-Fi connectivity to office of the Principal, IQAC, classrooms and laboratories.
- **Computers:** Institution has 22 nos. of desktop computers with i3 Processors, 4GB RAM, 1TB HDD and one Acer XEON server.
- **Printers:** The college has 5 printers (EPSON L130 Colour Printer, Brother HL L 2361 DN Laser Printer, Canon Image Class MF4820d, Epson L6270, HP LaserJet M208DW), one photocopy machine (Ricoh MP25011), and one flatbed scanner.
- **Software:** The institute has licensed copies of Windows Operating System, MS Office and also works with open-source operating systems like Ubuntu OS, MySQL database, and other software tools.
- **CCTV Surveillance:** Classrooms and corridors of the institution are covered with CP Plus 2.4 MP DOME Camera
- **UPS Facility:** The institution has one 8KVA Online UPS and one 10 KVA solar powered inverter.
- **Cyber Security:** The institute uses ESET Multi device Security antivirus program to protect devices from malicious activities. All computers are regularly updated with latest antivirus database.
- **LMS:** The institution is a registered member of the SWAYAM Local Chapter and additionally manages a YouTube account. Tutorial videos on a range of topics by faculty members are uploaded in it. Department of Computer Science also maintains an E-library to provide study materials.
- **College Website/ Applications:** ICT cell of the college provides technical support to develop and maintain the college official website, and the college online admission portal.
- **Online Admission Portal:** The Samarth e-gov suite has been implemented in the college by Govt. of Assam for conducting online admissions. The college also has an indigenously developed online admission system. It was successfully used in 2021 and 2022 to carry out the admission process.
- **Fee Collection Software:** The college has developed a fee collection software for collecting student admission fees.
- **Online Attendance System:** An online mechanism for recording attendance of students has been implemented in the college.

Governing Body: The college has an effective and functional GB formed as per Govt. guidelines (Vide

Promotion: CAS promotion proposals have been submitted to DHE following the statutory guidelines of UGC after expert evaluation of API score.

Service Rules: All employees adhere to the rules and regulations of the government for academic and non-academic functions.

Samarth: Samarth e-gov suite has been implemented in the college as per the instruction of DHE.

Govt. & Non-Govt. Funds :

- Govt. of Assam has sanctioned Rs. 10 crores for the construction of approach road, raising boundary wall, earth filling in the campus, two storied staff quarters, two storied boys' hostel, and two-storied laboratory complex.
- College Play Field has been upgraded with a fund of Rs.8 lakhs.
- Govt. of Assam has given administrative approval of Rs. 95 lakhs as Infrastructural Development Fund for the construction of canteen, Boys' and Girls' Common room.
- Staff quarter water supply system was installed and removed using Rs. 170000/- from MLA fund.
- Two smart classrooms were constructed with improved ICT facilities. Also, Ministry of Minority Affairs has provided two projectors.
- The college has received a solar panel (10KW) with Inverter facility (Luminous) from ICICI foundation.

Self-Fund Generation:

- Revenue generation is planned from vermi-composting, farming of fish, ornamental fish and black soldier fly farming.
- Reprographic facilities are provided with nominal charges.
- Consultancy services were provided to Kharupetia College for development and maintenance of online student admission system.

Community Support:

- The college sensitizes on health, hygiene, and empowerment for the underprivileged.
- The NSS volunteers provides shramdhan. The unit has also adopted a village and a school.

- Six schools have been adopted for supporting, mentoring and motivating nearby students.

6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1

Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/ nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)

Response:

PDUAM Dalgaon has a systematic financial management system. All financial transactions are managed and monitored by the Accounts Branch. The GB regularly monitors proper and effective utilization of financial resources with the help of an effective and transparent auditing mechanism. Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal/external). The college has constituted a Construction and Purchase committee for proper utilization of funds. The college maintains its accounts in two banks namely CANARA BANK (Mangaldai Branch) & ASSAM GRAMIN VIKASH BANK (Kharupetia Branch). Development fund, General fund & Student Union fund are maintained in Canara Bank. Examination fund is maintained in AGV Bank. NSS fund is maintained in SBI (Kharupetia Branch). College makes transaction process through NEFT & Cheque.

Local Audit:

The Institution has a local audit team for auditing all the accounts of the college. The audit team scrutinizes and verifies details of cashbook, cash receipts, cash vouchers, fee deposit receipts, donation receipts etc., and submit an audit report. The team's valuable suggestions have helped to develop a healthy financial mechanism in the college.

Statutory Audit (Chartered Accountant):

The college maintains several accounts and Statutory Audit of all the accounts are done by a GB appointed Chartered Accountant. The junior assistant (in-charge of accounts) maintains all the accounts of government and non-government funds on behalf of the Principal.

External Financial Audit by Directorate of Audit, Govt. of Assam:

As it is a newly established institution, the college is yet to be audited by the state government's external audit.

Government Funds:

- Govt. of Assam has sanctioned Rs.10 cores under the Signature Scheme for the infrastructural development work. Under this scheme, an approach road, raising of boundary wall, earth filling, a two-storied staff quarter, a two-storied boys' hostel and a two storied laboratory building are under construction by PWD, Govt. of Assam.
- The college playground is upgraded with Rs. 8,00,000/- under the Chief Minister Samagra Gramya Unnayan Yojona (CMSGUY).
- As per requirement of the college, Govt. of Assam has given administrative approval of Rs. 95 Lakhs for the construction of a canteen, Boys' and Girls' common rooms.
- Staff quarters water supply system was installed and removed using Rs. 170000/- from MLA fund of Dalgaon constituency. The work was executed and monitored by the MLA.
- The college NSS Unit received an amount of Rs. 44,500/- to conduct its activities.

Central government funds:

- The college has registered at Unnat Bharat Abhiyan in 2023. The procedure is still in initial stage.
- College has applied for Rs 5 crores under PMUSHA.

Non-government funds:

- The college has received Solar Panel (10KW) with Inverter facility (Luminous) from ICICI foundation.
- Mr. Kulen Hazarika, an entrepreneur from Dalgaon, has contributed to the construction of a cycle stand.

PDUAM, Dalgaon is a co-education institution. On conducting gender audit, the college has found 30.4% of students are female. The institute ensures a safe academic and working environment for its students and employees. The institute has adopted adequate measures for the promotion of gender equity and it is envisaged in the mission of the college to increase the ratio of enrolment of girl students in this educationally backward area. The institution is committed to adopt zero tolerance against gender discrimination and sexual harassment. The measures taken are stated below:

- Providing safety and security to its students, particularly its girl students, is the topmost priority of the college. The college has an enclosed campus with partial CCTV surveillance. Moreover, entry and exit of visitors are monitored round-the-clock by the gatekeeper. To ensure that no student has to undergo security checks every time they enter the college premises, wearing college ID has been made mandatory.
- Constitution of Women Cell, Grievance Redressal Cell, Internal Complaints Cell, and Anti-Ragging Committee as part of its mechanism to address various grievances of the students and to ensure discipline in the college campus.
- Encourages participation of women members in various bodies, committees and cells (Students' Union, Governing Body, Academic Committee etc.) to advance gender equality. This ensures gender equity as it promotes good governance, efficiency and protects the interest of both girl students and women employees.

1. Title of the Practice: Biodiversity Conservation and Solid Waste Management

2. Objectives of the Practice:

- To make and create awareness regarding the importance of bio-diversity, especially the endemic components among the students of PDUAM, Dalgaon as well as the stakeholders.
- To adopt innovative approaches for conservation of certain bio-diversity components in order to provide hands-on-training on conservation practices so far adopted among the students.
- To create socio-economic as well as environmental values of bio-diversity.

3. The Context: PDUAM, Dalgaon is situated in a rural area in the 68 no. Dalgaon constituency. The villages around the colleges are mostly minority dominated. The people are agriculture dependent. Although they are dependent on agriculture, natural environment and bio-diversity, fortunately or unfortunately their conservative approaches towards their environment is very poor. Lack of proper scientific knowledge is the reason behind it. They are concerned with the productivity of their target crops ignoring sustainability. Looking at the pitiable condition of conservative approach, the college has initiated the conservation of Black Soldier Fly (BSF) in the college campus.

4. The Practice: The practice was conducted under laboratory condition at the Department of Zoology. The Black Soldier Flies are cultured by using organic wastes, especially the slaughterhouse wastes and also the wasted vegetables. The raw material used to culture black soldier fly is itself a new initiative for value-addition of those wastes. The larvae are used for feeding of carnivorous fishes as well as livestock poultry, bakery and piggery due to high-protein content and other nutritional values. Moreover, to set an example, PDUAM, Dalgaon has also adopted

some other bio-diversity conservation methods, which includes ornamental fish breeding and bird-house preparation. Ornamental fish breeding has been successfully completed and different birds have come and built their nests in the bird houses built for the purpose. The Department of Zoology in collaboration with Eco-Club of the college has also conducted an awareness programme on “Bird-house Construction and Installation”. Inside the college campus, we are also trying to conserve and enrich the plant bio-diversity so far. We are trying to provide best habitat for frugivorous birds by planting wild fruit-yielding plants inside the campus.

5. **Evidence of Success:** The Black Soldier Fly cultivation has been successfully carried out in the college as some institutes like Silapathar college of Dhemaji district and the Zoology Department of Gauhati University have expressed their interest and willingness to culture the Black Soldier Fly in their respective campuses. PDUAM, Dalgaon has provided the required amenities to these institutes.
6. **Problems Encountered and Resources Required:** Creating awareness among the villagers for the development of scientific attitude is quite difficult in an area where communities are illiterate and economically backward. Moreover, mobilization of financial resources to carry out the programmes is a challenge since no fund is provided by the government for such activities.

Best Practice II

1. Title of the Practice: Online Attendance System

2. Objectives: The objectives of the practice are—

1. To provide a digital platform to record student class attendance.
2. To bring transparency in the record of students' attendance.
3. To reduce the use of paper through the use of digital system.
4. To assist the parents to keep vigil on the attendance of their wards.
5. To provide mechanism for online attendance report generation.

3. **The Context:** With the rapid advancements in ICT, most manual day-to-days task in various organizations are automated. One such repetitive task is to record attendance of students in colleges and schools which is still carried out manually and maintained in register books. The manual recording of student attendance leads to unnecessary wastage of papers, as they are left unused after the end of a semester. And over the years can lead to storage issues. Addressing the global need to reduce the use of papers, PDUAM, Dalgaon has resolved to go paperless for recording of students' attendance online using a software indigenously developed by the college. This software is being used by the teachers to record the class attendance during the class using hand-held devices like smartphones. On the other hand, students can monitor to their attendance in all the courses enrolled by the student. Further, the guardian of the students can check or keep track of the attendance of his/her child/children. Further, the software will help the teachers in automated generation of attendance reports for a particular class. Another beneficial aspect of the attendance system is that the teachers can save details of the topic discussed in that class for which the attendance is recorded. Overall, the online attendance system is a very crucial system required for any institution and it is considered as a best practice of our college. Also, the college authority can monitor the attendance of the students and activities of teachers in the classrooms.

4. The Practice:

- The online attendance system is made available for the students, teachers and guardians (www.cpdal.in) from October, 2021.
- The teachers have been recording attendance of the students in the online portal.
- The students and guardians are given access to the attendance record through login ID and

password.

- Monitoring of attendance record is carried out periodically by teachers.

5. Evidence of success and problem encountered:

- The practice also reduces paperwork and is quite convenient for keeping records.
- It helps in saving time of maintaining manual attendance.
- It has increased transparency in the attendance recording process.
- Guardians have reported their use of the system to track their wards' attendance.
- The students can also easily keep track of their own attendance and reduce the task of manual verification of attendance.
- The system enable participation of all four major components of academic activities of the college i.e., Principal, teachers, students and guardians.
- Though this practice has greatly benefitted the teaching-learning community? the inadequacy of good internet connectivity stands as a barrier in the continuation of the practice.

7.3 Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1

Portray the performance of the Institution in one area distinctive to its priority and thrust within 1000 words

Response:

PDUAM Dalgaon considers "providing service to the educationally deprived groups" as its institutional distinctiveness.

PDUAM Dalgaon provides education for socially deprived groups having poor enrollment in higher education. Since our college is located in a socially and educationally backward area, our institution not only provides higher education in science for students but also tries to eradicate the superstitions prevailing in the community.

- 1.The college offers 17 Add-on courses to develop/strengthen specific career skills among the students. The courses offered in our college are job focused and provide a wide range of skills to the individuals so that they can perform much more confidently and efficiently at work place. As majority of the students of the college come from rural areas with weak economic background, such initiatives help them to have a prior knowledge of the job responsibilities and also to easily adapt to the work environment and quickly advance in their careers. The courses are designed for one month and in weekly manner where the college faculties provide hands on practical sessions for the students.
- 2.The college has online Admission Portal, online fee collection application, student attendance

monitoring portal and e- voting system.

3. College tries to provide competent framework to facilitate effective learning environment (Smart Classroom, Central library, Common rooms for boys and girls, hostel facilities, gymnasium, playground both Indoor/outdoor, amphitheater, pure drinking water, facilities for differently abled students and conference hall).
4. Each faculty member of the college is allotted with certain number of students for their mentoring process and apart from mentor-mentee counseling, the college also arranges counseling session by professional persons in both online and offline mode.
5. The college has a Career Counselling Cell for students to make them aware of career and placement opportunities as well as entrepreneurship skills. The cell organizes training and career related programmes to acquaint the students for various entrance examinations to higher educational institutions and other career related advancements.
6. The college provides assistance in obtaining scholarships to the students such as Fee Wavier Scheme, National Merit Scholarship, State Merit Scholarship, Post Matric Scholarship for SC/ST/OBC Students, Scholarship for Physically Handicapped Students, Merit cum means Scholarship for the students of minority community.
7. The college has 5 well equipped laboratories under various departments. There are 21 nos. of Intel 7th Generator Core i3 (7100) desktops, one Intel Xeon AT310 Server, 300 MBPS Speed Wireless ADSL 2/2+ Broadband Routers with USB Ports, Wi-Fi Adapters for all desktops & servers, printer with duplex & networking, Flatbed scanner and 10KVA online UPS.
8. Central library of our college is partially automated which uses Integrated Library Management system software **KOHA** (*Version 22.05.09*). It has modules such as cataloguing, circulation, acquisition, serial management, report generator and patron management. Our library has a separate digital repository section which provides question papers and e-books. Also, our library website provides open access e-resources, study materials and different magazines. Currently our library has subscription of seven print journals/ magazines namely *Prantik*, *Current Science* (Scopus Indexed), *Competition Success Review*, *Sportstar*, *Yojana*, *Satasari* (UGC- Care List) and *University News*
9. The college provides the students with basic health facilities by organizing special health camps, blood donation camps, and awareness programme on malnutrition, women's health and hygiene from time to time.
10. The college has signed MoU for mutual cooperation with other institutes. The following MoUs have been signed:
 - MoU with Aquaculture and Biodiversity Centre, Gauhati University, Guwahati, Assam for research extension and training.
 - MoU with Udalguri College, Udalguri, Assam for student exchange programme, internships, faculty development programme, research and publications.
 - MoU with Sipajhar College, Sipajhar, Darrang, Assam for co-operation in the area of skill training, education and indoor/outdoor sports.
 - MoU with MANTRA Associates, Jalukbari, Guwahat, Assam for joint training, education, research and development.
 - MoU with New Sankar Aajan Diagnostic Centre, Kharupetia, Darrang, Assam for laboratory visits, programs and practical related courses on Clinal Laboratory.
