ICSSR-NERC SPONSORED NATIONAL SEMINAR

"Integrating Indigenous Knowledge Systems for Sustainable Development: Tradition, Innovation and Policy Making"

1. Introduction

Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Adarsha Mahavidyalaya (PDUAM), Dalgaon, organized a two-day National Seminar on "Integrating Indigenous Knowledge for Sustainable Development: Tradition, Innovation and Policymaking" on 16–17 October 2025. The seminar was sponsored by the Indian Council of Social Science Research – North Eastern Regional Centre (ICSSR–NERC), Shillong, and supported by the RAHI Foundation and other dignitaries.

The event aimed to provide a platform for academicians, researchers, and policymakers to deliberate on the relevance of indigenous knowledge systems (IKS) in promoting sustainability, bridging traditional wisdom with modern innovation, and influencing policy processes for inclusive development.

2. Objectives of the Seminar

- 1. To explore the role of Indigenous Knowledge Systems in promoting sustainable development.
- 2. To understand the integration of traditional practices with modern innovation and technology.
- 3. To identify policy measures that can institutionalize Indigenous Knowledge in governance.
- 4. To create awareness among young researchers and students about the preservation and documentation of IKS.
- 5. To encourage collaborative research across disciplines linking tradition, innovation, and sustainability.

3. Inaugural Session (16 October 2025, 10:00 AM – 11:15 AM)

The seminar commenced with registration followed by the inaugural session held at the Central Library Hall, PDUAM, Dalgaon from 10.00AM

Dr. Riju Devi welcomed the dignitaries and participants, followed by lighting of the ceremonial lamp and a prayer song led by the Governing Body President. The seminar overview was presented by Dr. Kumar Chandan Jyoti, Convener of the Seminar.

Dr. L.P. Hazarika, Principal and Chief Patron, delivered the inaugural address highlighting the importance of knowledge preservation in the age of globalization. The Book of Abstracts with ISBN-978-81-97-100833 was released during the programme.

Discussions during these sessions emphasized different practices of community, environmental sustainability, indigenous livelihoods, and the integration of IKS into the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 framework.

The valedictory session summarized the two-day deliberations.

- 5. Participants reaffirmed the importance of North-East India as a living repository of traditional wisdom.

8. Recommendations

- Establishment of Indigenous Knowledge Resource Cells in higher educational institutions.
- Integration of IKS components in the NEP 2020 framework for education and research.
- Policy-level encouragement for local innovation and traditional crafts.
- Funding for interdisciplinary projects.
- Encouragement of time-bound publications and edited volumes from selected papers emerging from seminar deliberations.
